DigitalKidZ® STE (A) M is an educational program developed by the Digital Children Foundation team - all training revenues are used to support the Foundation's activities. The program was developed entirely on game principles, tailored to the psycho-emotional development of children between 7 and 12 years of age. The goal is to increase motivation to learn and to promote communication skills, teamwork skills, creativity and innovation. Skills to work in a foreign language environment are developed, too. The foundation has a focus on STE (A) M Skills - Applied Science, Technology, Engineering, Creativity and Mathematics. It explains complicated concepts of school in plain language and prepare the children for the professions of the future.

- **Take part in BIG PICNIC: project at the University Botanical Garden - Sofia**

University Botanic Gardens of the Sofia University "Saint Kliment Ohridski" represent three botanic gardens in three locations – the cities of Sofia and Varna and the town of Balchik. They were established at different times and are different in appearance and specifics. Their task is to expand the knowledge about the plant kingdom and to carry out activities on *ex situ* conservation of rare and endangered plant species. The University Botanic Gardens have a scientific, educational, social and cultural mission which they promote and develop.

- **JA Bulgaria**

The site covers 97% of the study material for students from grades 1 to 12. The materials follow the official school curriculum and comply with the State Educational Standards. The platform is awarded with the Best Educational Site Award for Bulgaria for three consecutive years (2012-2014), and in 2018 it becomes

the site of the Year in the categories "Site for Services" and "Product Website".

- **Connecting learning with museums -**

In the last decade museums broaden their missions and became the institutes where learning theory is turned into action. They use their spaces to create learning experiences for all visitors. When students are involved in active learning, not only in acquiring the information, they are more motivated to learn. Students can interact with museum collections and spaces and use technologies (like Virtual reality). Via the museum collections students can improve their understanding of history.
